July 1, 2021, minimum wage to be adjusted annually using local consumer price index. Fremont's minimum wage ordinance exempts employees of non-profit corporations.

Berkeley	Alameda	122,324	Effective July 1, 2019, employers in the City of Berkeley must pay a minimum wage rate of \$15.59 per hour to employees working in the city. Effective July 1, 2020, employers must pay a minimum wage rate of \$15.59 per hour, plus any increase in the CPI.

Daly City	San Mateo	107,074	On January 14, 2019, the City Council of Daly City adopted the Daly City Minimum Wage Ordinance that will increase the local minimum wage to \$15.00 by 2021. The local minimum wage will increase at a faster pace than the State of California's minimum wage schedule. The local minimum wage applies to all businesses and employees that work two (2) or more hours per week within the boundaries of the City of Daly City.
San Mateo	San Mateo	104,748	On August 15, 2016, the San Mateo City Council adopted a Minimum Wage Ordinance which requires annual increases in the Minimum Wage paid within the City boundaries, above and beyond the wage required by the State. The City Council adopted a wage schedule whereby most employers will be required to pay \$15 per hour by 2019. Non-profit organizations that are tax-exempt per Section 501(c)(3) of the tax code are provided with an extended time frame to reach \$15 per hour. Beginning January 1, 2020, and annually thereafter, the City will adjust the minimum wage based on the Regional Consumer Price Index
