

CIVIL EMERGENCY ORDER NUMBER 1 — REVISED

ORDER SETTING CURFEW DURING EXISTENCE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

JUNE 1, 2020

WHEREAS, June 1, 2020 at 11:00 a.m., pursuant to Ordinance No. 2-24.050 of the City of Santa Rosa, the Director of Emergency Services proclaimed the existence of a local emergency within the City of Santa Rosa due to violence and civil unrest surrounding protests arising from the tragic death of George Floyd on May 25, 2020, in Minneapolis, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, while the majority of protesters have acted lawfully, a significant number of people have engaged in criminal behavior, including violence, vandalism of public and private property, looting and failure to follow the lawful dispersal orders of the Santa Rosa Police Department; and

WHEREAS, it is imminently necessary to use extraordinary measures to protect the public peace, safety and welfare within the City of Santa Rosa; and

WHEREAS, the proclamation of a local emergency as provided by Ordinance No. 2-24.050 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such local emergency pursuant to Ordinance No. 2-24.050(A)(6)(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, a curfew is hereby imposed throughout the City of Santa Rosa as follows:

1. No persons, except as set forth below, shall be upon any public street, avenue, alley, park, way or other public property or upon any unimproved private real property within the boundaries of the City between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.
2. The law enforcement forces of this City along with other law enforcement authorities cooperating with the City are hereby authorized and charged to the extent provided by law with the responsibility of enforcing this curfew, and are further authorized to arrest such persons as do not obey this curfew after due notice, oral or written, has been given to said person.
3. A violation the curfew shall be punishable as a misdemeanor pursuant to Ordinance No. 2-24.090.
4. This Order shall not apply to:
 - a. Law enforcement personnel, firefighting personnel, emergency health care providers and other emergency personnel deployed in the area;

- b. Credentialed media representatives engaged in news gathering;
- c. Individuals who are in the course of traveling directly to and from work or to obtain medical assistance; and
- d. Persons who are experiencing homelessness who remain sheltered in place in a single location.
- e. Medical facilities, pharmacies, cannabis dispensaries and gas stations may remain open to the public. All other businesses must be closed to the public during the time of curfew.

5. This Order shall remain in effect until 5:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 4, 2020.
