During the fourth quarter, CAP Sonoma funded 102 total households; 80 households for rent assistance and 22 households for security deposit. 18 out of the 26 households who completed the 3-month rent assistance program also decreased their debt by at least 10%. Due to COVID, we have not had an inperson financial literacy workshops and all information is shared one-on one with clients. We meet individually with clients and provide one-on-one financial coaching and go over some financial concepts with them, such as: budgeting, savings, credit & managing debt. We will start having virtual workshops via zoom starting July 7th. We will hold two zoom workshops monthly: one in Spanish and one in English. Each workshop will be mandatory, while taking into consideration barriers to access, and will include polls to ensure interaction. We have a new full-time staff who will help with the workshops.
