



Improvements can include an accessible play structure or work out stations if they are added and easy access to other amenities like benches, tables by having a paved path to the bench or table. For the basketball court it should be repayed to create a smooth surface with hoops that can be lowered so those in wheelchairs can play on the court, the ciurt will also need to well maintained as bumps and cracks can pose a safety risk for people with mobility or vision disabilities.

better connectivity and safety around the neighborhood

I live on Earle st on the East side of the pedestrian bridge. I never visit the park because the area near the entrance to the overpass is not somewhere I feel comfortable walking with my baby. The activity at the car wash and the abandoned vehicles at the dead end of south A make me nervous. I'm happy to share my neighborhood with my unhoused neighbors who use the overpass passing through and those who are living in their vehicles and I am not talking about them. But there are quite a few people who take advantage of the dead end nature of our street and the seemingly absentee car wash owner and use the area inappropriately. I would be happy if incorporating the city lot on the east side increases appropriate traffic to the area and in turn discourages the shady activity in that corner.

Improve the vacant City land (triangular shape, east of 101); it is frequently used by homeless people who can be seen doing drugs in the bushes. This area could easily be incorporated with the east end of pedestrian crossing using similiar techniques for creating safe and secure public spaces. Drug use is very evident at the car wash; maybe a few civic improvements around the east side of Pedestrian Crossing could alleviate this activity.

South Davis Park is a good park. The noise level from 101 and the 12 on-ramp is a bit loud. There's a hole in one of the sound walls that seems to add to the noise. I'd really like to see the basketball court upgraded. The playing surface is awful for games, and the curb behind the hoop is very unsafe for any sort of pick-up game. I love all the trees in the park, so I wouldn't change anything in that regard. It does seem like the grass area south of the basketball court gets very little use. Maybe adding a bocce ball court would be a good use of the space. I'd prefer to not add any park tables or meeting areas, because it's going to attract homeless people from outside the neighborhood.

The trees leave debris all over the ground and in the sand causing the sand to be dirty. More trash cans and a better water fountain, bathrooms that were monitored frequently or even locked at night so that way they don't get vandalized. Security for this park would help with the random people who are in the vicinity, maybe this would help to make it safer.

More modern park like Coffey Park and more to do for the toddlers. They have a very small section in the park.

The sidewalks in the neighborhood around the park are non-existent or unsafe. It isn't well accessable by foot

Divide the park into zones 1. In the north end supplement the existing small forest with more native trees and increase the number of benches for a quieter user. 2. Add more picnic tables, barbeques and drinking fountains to encourage groups to gather 3. A noisier area with play equipment, ziplines, exercise stations, a ball wall, and half court basketball Don't add any formal paths but leave as much hardy shade tolerant grass and natural surfacing such as a finer mulch so the ground can absorb maximum rainfall and reduce runoff. Plant native plants that do not require much water once established because we have to adapt to new weather patterns.
