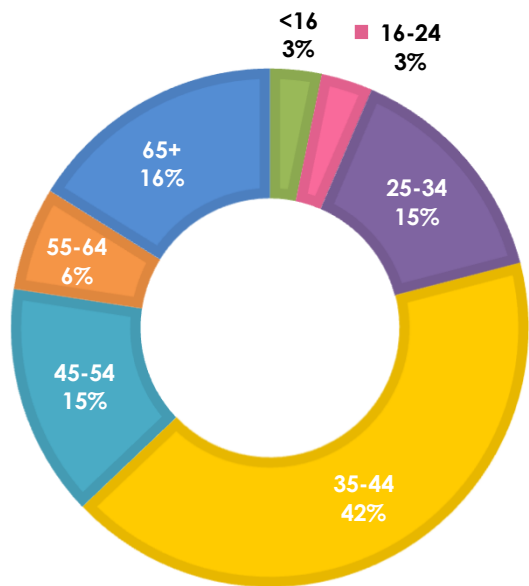
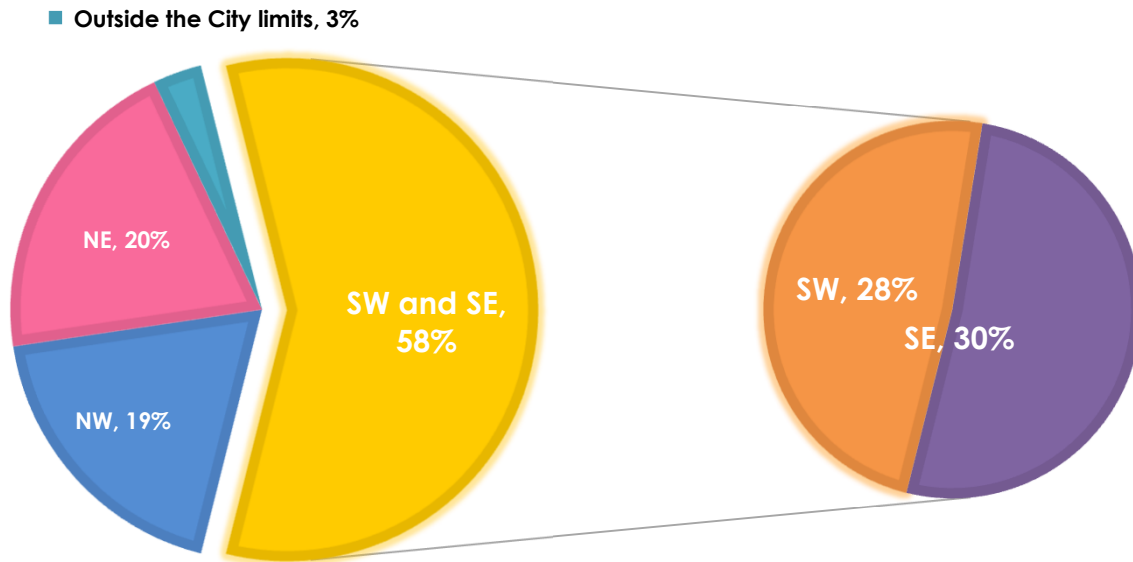

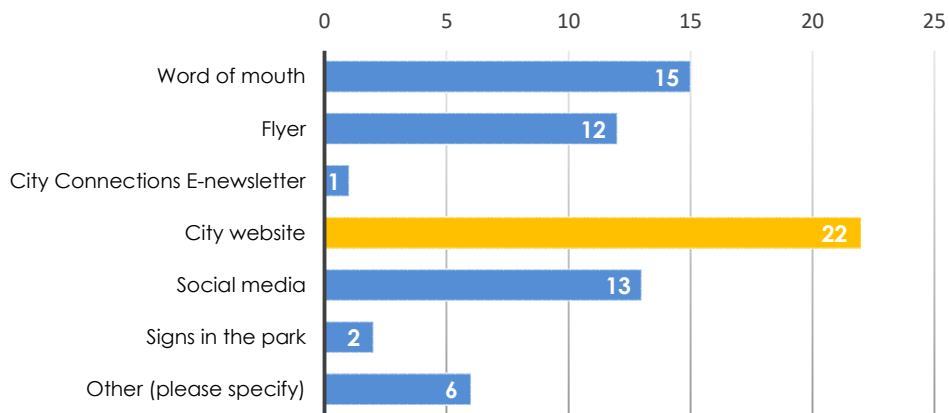

WHERE IN THE CITY DO YOU LIVE?

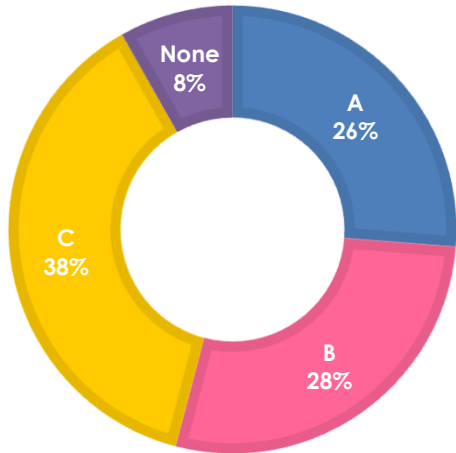


HOW DID YOU HEAR ABOUT THIS SURVEY?

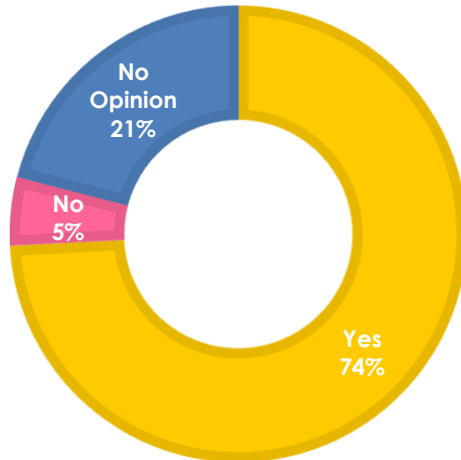

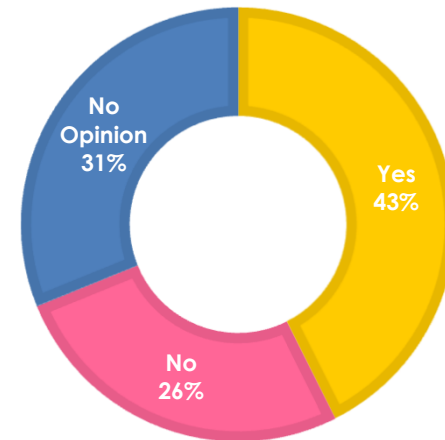
WHICH CONCEPTUAL PLAYGROUND LOCATION DO YOU PREFER?



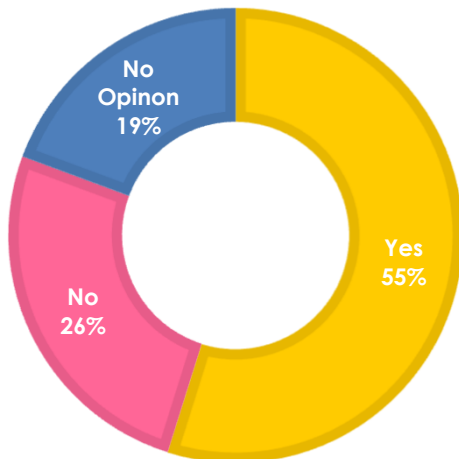
WOULD YOU PREFER THE PLAY AREAS TO BE PHYSICALLY SEPARATED FROM THE ROAD?



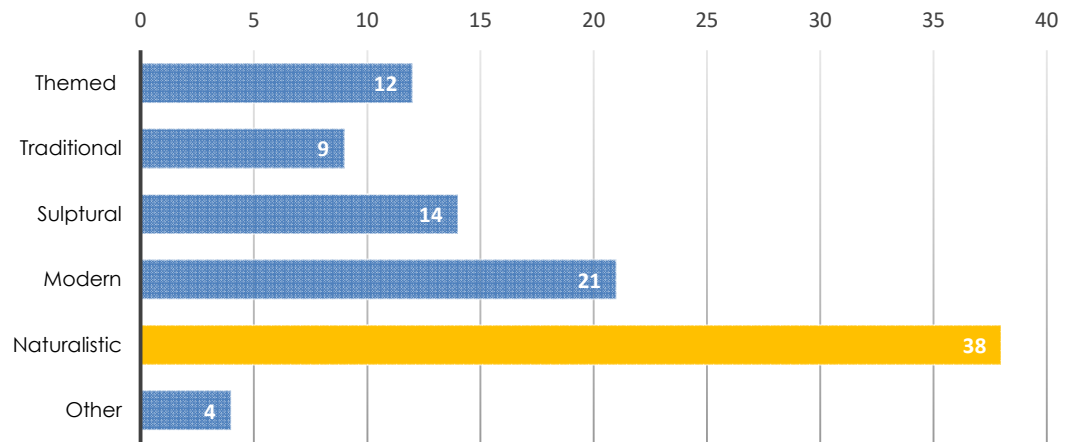
WOULD YOU PREFER THE PLAY AREAS TO BE PHYSICALLY SEPARATED FROM THE FITNESS STATIONS?



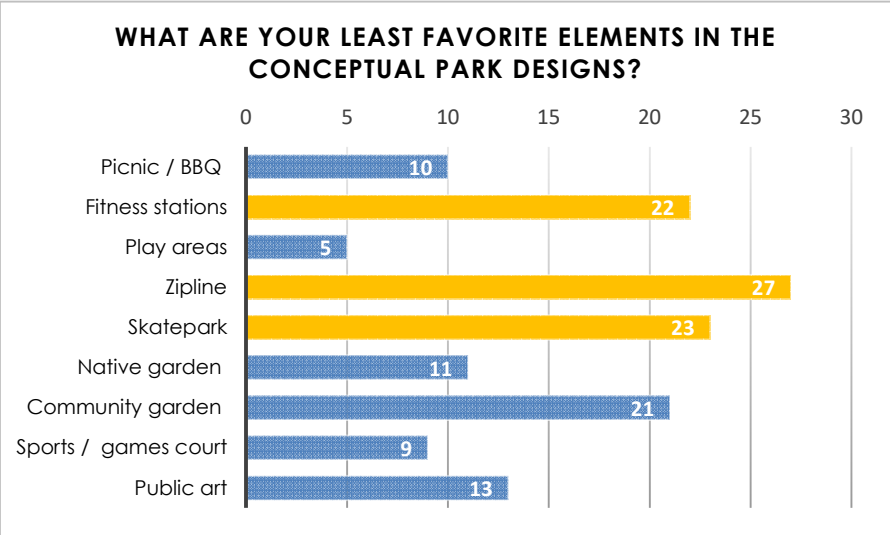
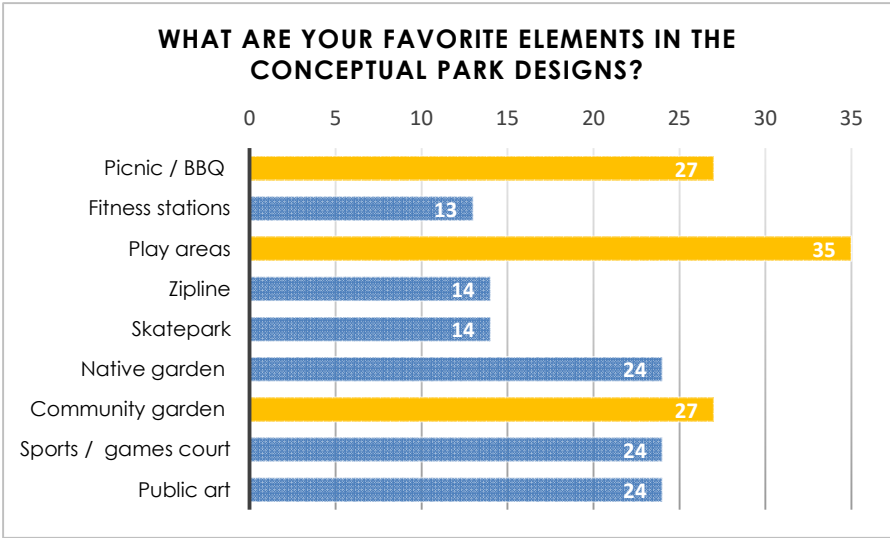
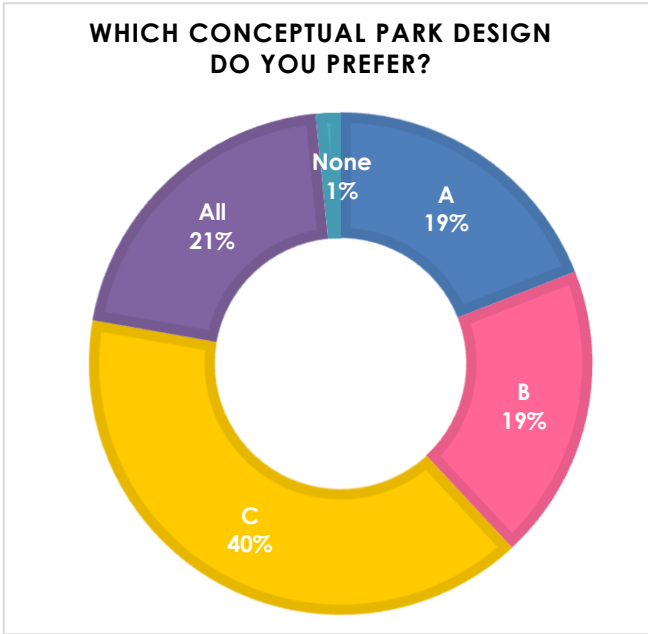
DO YOU PREFER THE PLAY AREAS TO BE FENCED?



WHAT STYLE OF PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT DO YOU PREFER?

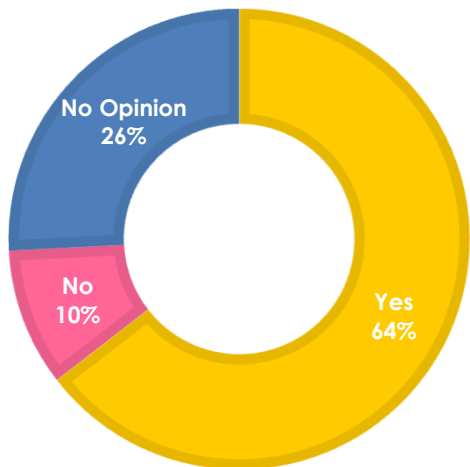

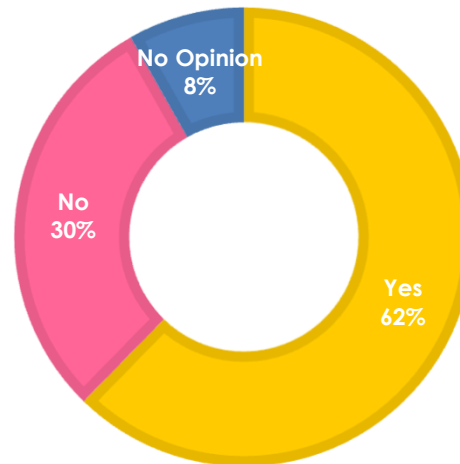

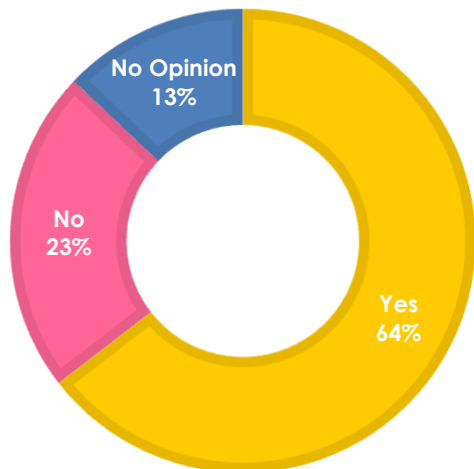
WOULD YOU PREFER TO SEE THE EXISTING STEEL FENCE REPLACED WITH A SOLID CONCRETE BLOCK WALL?



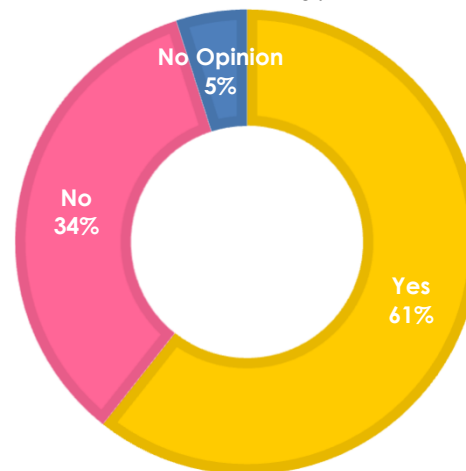
DO YOU SUPPORT THE REMOVAL OF THE EXISTING EUCALYPTUS TREES ALONG THE STEEL FENCE?

Do you have anything else you'd like to share to help shape the future of South Davis Park?

<p>I am excited to have a park a couple blocks away that will be updated so my toddler will have a wonderful park to call home. Something I am concerned about is the amount of shade and the children's play areas, during the summer some parks are absolutely intolerable because of the lack of shade. If possible to keep many if not all of the trees and place would be excellent.</p>
<p>Adding water fountains to drink from would be a great idea and adding a tiny dog park is nice</p>
<p>Please gauge volunteer levels before putting in volunteer required areas such as community gardens. If they are not abundantly supported it becomes an area of degradation. Please ensure there is proper safety and homeless deterrents such as fencing, lighting, and regular maintenance of trash etc. Will there be a bathroom? Small children typically need access to a bathroom.</p>
<p>The dead end on Earle Street and South A needs to have a block wall for the noise pollution. I've lived on Earle Street my entire life (24 years old) and the noise pollution has always been annoying. The neighborhood would greatly benefit from that addition.</p>
<p>Would love a block wall at Earle and S. A st , also would recommend no parking signs because of trailers being parked at the deadends of Earle st , would not like bbq area there as it would invite overnights. We have a big issue with homeless , and with them using these areas it would be best to put something to deter them .</p>
<p>Ask the city aouthorities to keep always an eye in this projects, not just build them and forgot them</p>
<p>Yesss I do! Please please please do the park some good I've been playing at this park since I was able to walk and that like 20 years ago so please put some all good deed into this park</p>
<p>Don't bother with those microphone tube things in the playground, they always get filled with sand and stop working immediately</p>

<p>Have more police presence in that area , currently it doesn't feel safe.</p>
<p>I'd like to see a concrete block wall with Ivy grown on it at the north end like the south end has. I'd love to see artificial grass replacing the lawns.</p>

<p>ACCESSIBILITY. What about kids in chairs, kids with mobility limitations, where are the braille explainers for kids with limited sight. The visual designs are thoughtful but you've forgotten kids Of all kinds.</p>
<p>Because I live directly across the street from the park on the SW corner of S Davis & Carrington I want the park to remain mostly nature, green, trees, on the south portion of the park. Please no zipline, planter boxes unless placed elsewhere further north or on the other side of freeway. Am very concerned about noise emanating from the park that would disrupt my enjoyment of living here. Because I do not have off road parking am also very concerned that my parking will be taken up by park goers alot. Please do not over fill this small park with very many attractions. In my opinion less is more for this park. Also please stay away from any type of historical or community identity murals or plaques that could be political.</p>
<p>Conceptualize ways to keep EVERYONE moving from pre-k to seniors. If it becomes a space with just small kid structures, an under-utilized basketball court and some chess tables, it s a lost opportunity. How about a row of swing ball sets, a pickle ball court, a ninja slack line obstacle course, adult swings, zip line with adult weight capacity.</p>
<p>Shade is important so hopefully, if you do remove a lot of trees, you replace them with actual shade structures. Thanks for doing this!!!</p>
<p>Community Gardens, public fitness (fitness areas AND basketball) and play areas. These provide opportunities for the people of Santa Rosa who can't afford gyms, yards or other means of entertainment/fitness. Please bring all of them to our park.</p>

Bocce Ball court
So Davis park has been around before the freeway and utilized by many. One of which is George Maybee who is still interned on the USS Arizona in Pearl Harbor as one of the first sailors to die in the attack, it is because of these people we have this park and it is there legacy we are to remember as the core of Santa Rosa's values and what they stand for. He lived directly across the street from the park and a flag pole still flies in the front yard of the house.

Just think of safety for the kids as top priority
Please hurry! This needs to be a top priority. Thank you
if trees are removed would be good to see native tree replanted. All amenities will need to be accessible for people with disabilities especially work out stations/equipment if added. Paths will need to be well maintained as cracks and bumps (even small ones) pose a higher trip/fall hazard for people with mobility and or vision disabilities and should provide direct access to play equipment, green/open space and all other amenities. Given the multiple streets in the area crosswalks should be added and will need to be signalized with adequate trimming for someone to cross someone with a disability may need 20 seconds instead of 10 seconds, the button should also vibrate when it's safe to cross. Crosswalks will need to be highly visible by being painted large/bold stripes (similar to green ones used for bike lanes) and have curb extensions.
Thank you for your work to bring this wonderfully diverse and easily divided community together!!!
The addition of a (pay?) public toilet with area to wash hands would be optimal for children playing and families
