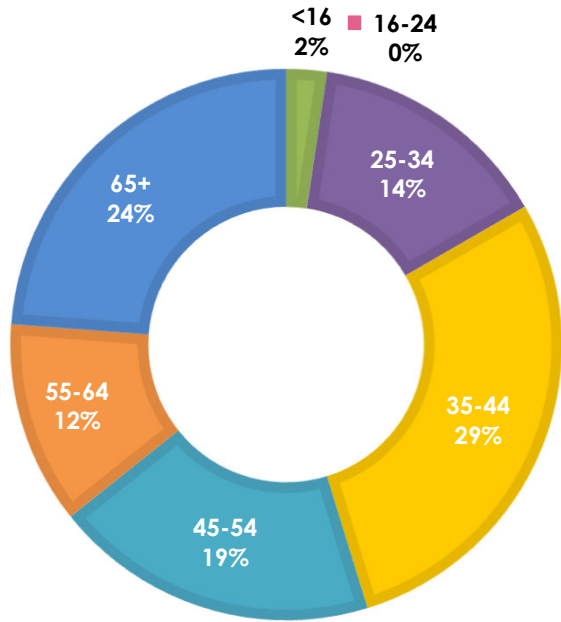
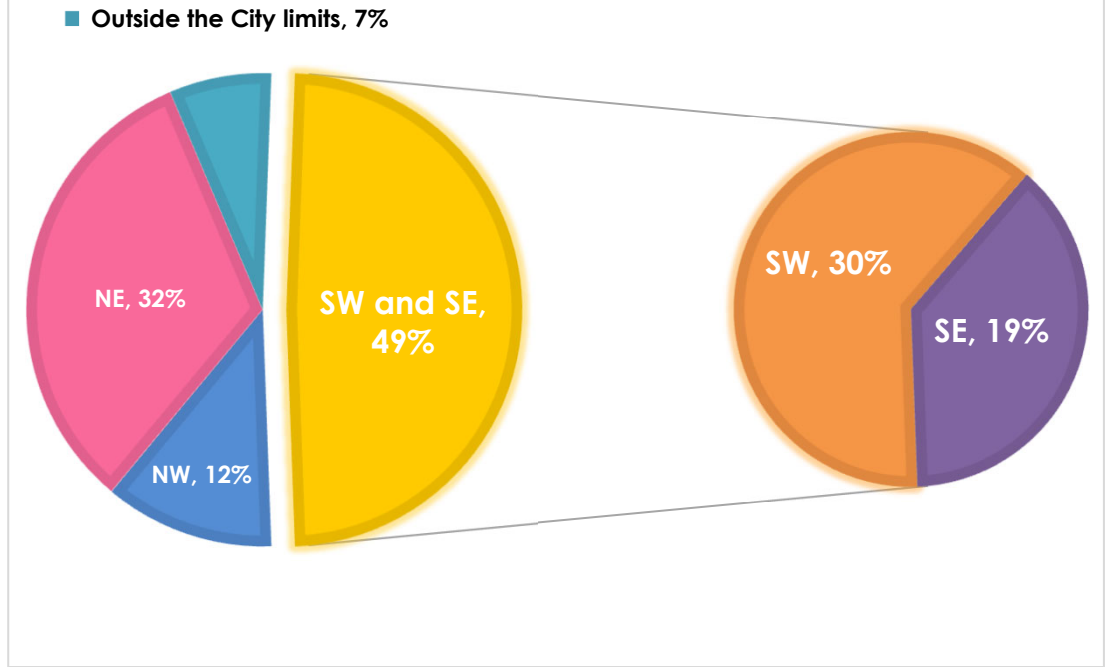

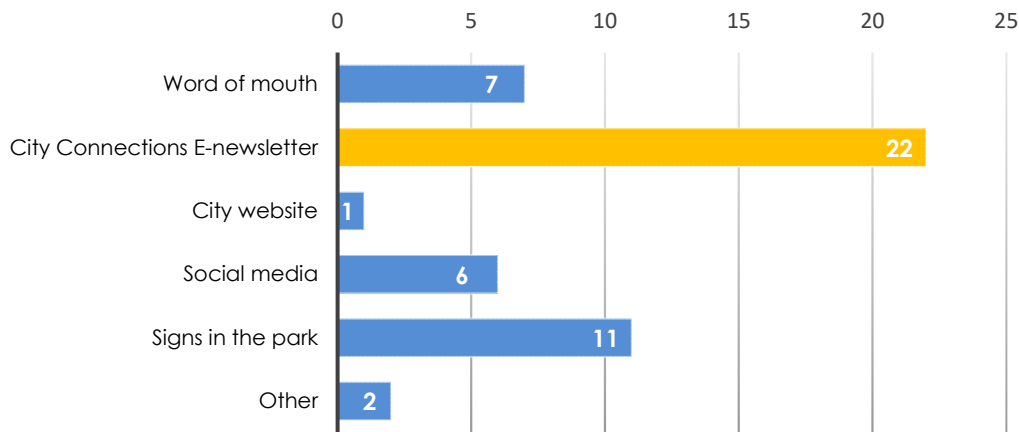

WHERE IN THE CITY DO YOU LIVE?

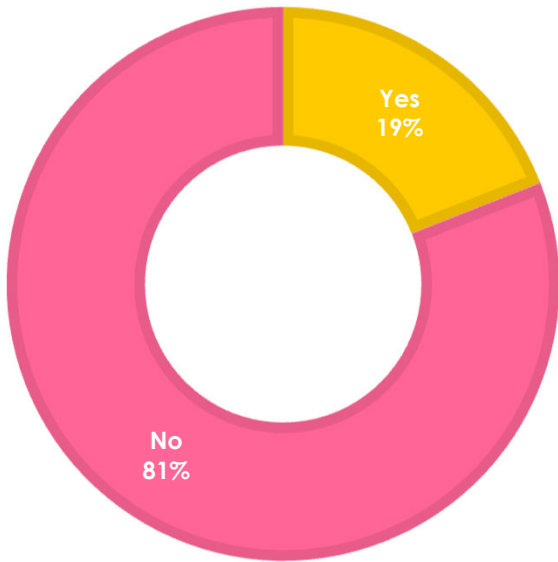


HOW DID YOU HEAR ABOUT THIS SURVEY?

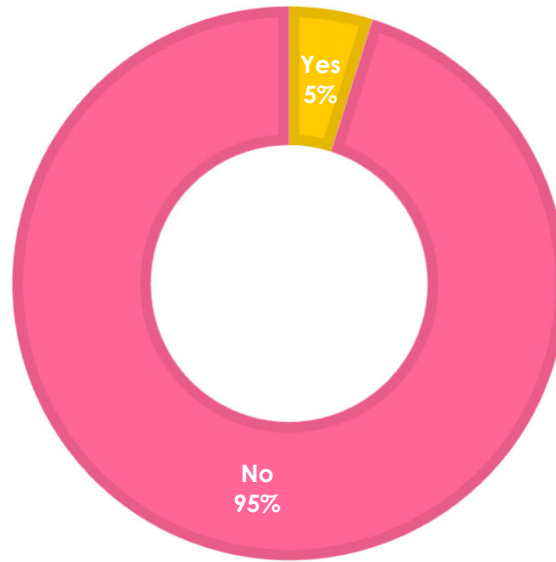

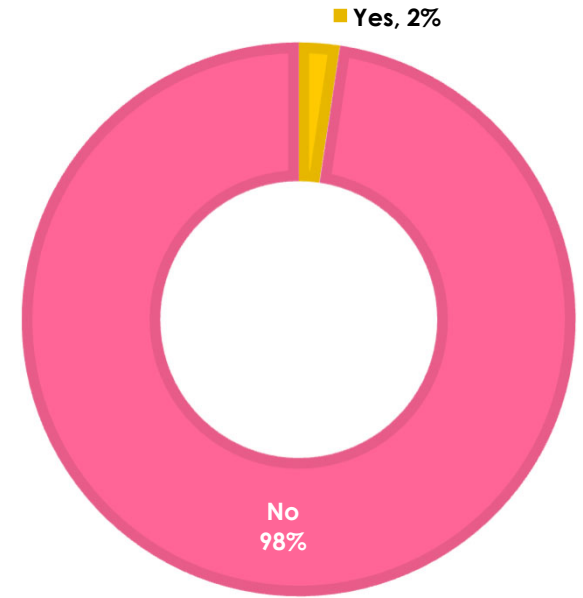

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN RENTING A COMMUNITY GARDEN PLOT AT SOUTH DAVIS PARK?

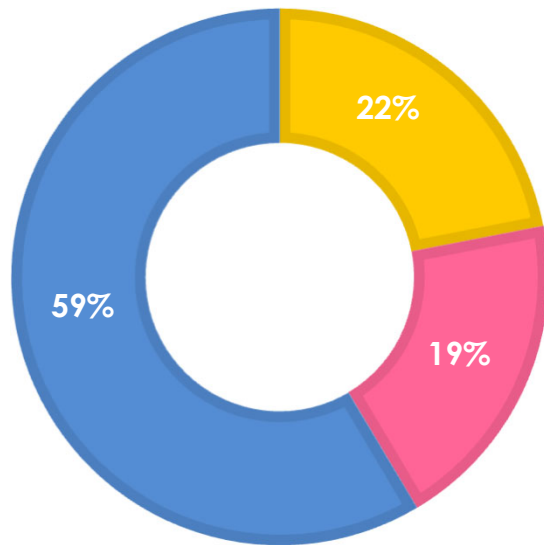

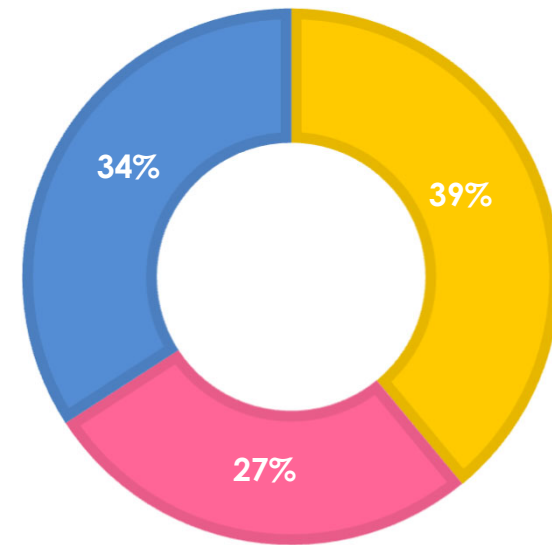

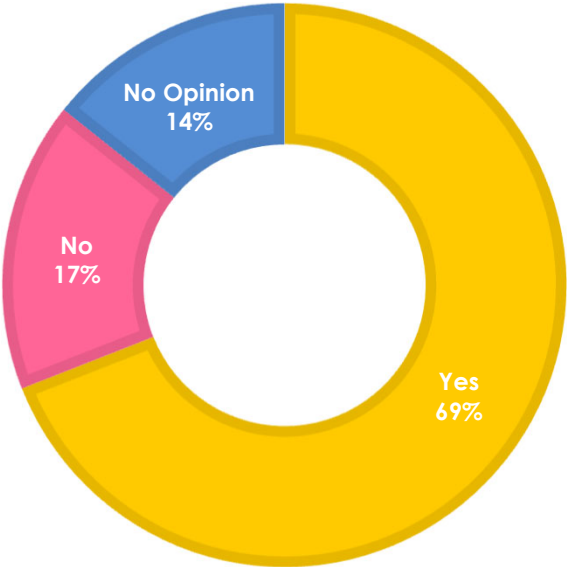
DO YOU HAVE A PREFERENCE FOR THE LOCATION OF AN ADDITIONAL ACTIVE RECREATION AREA?



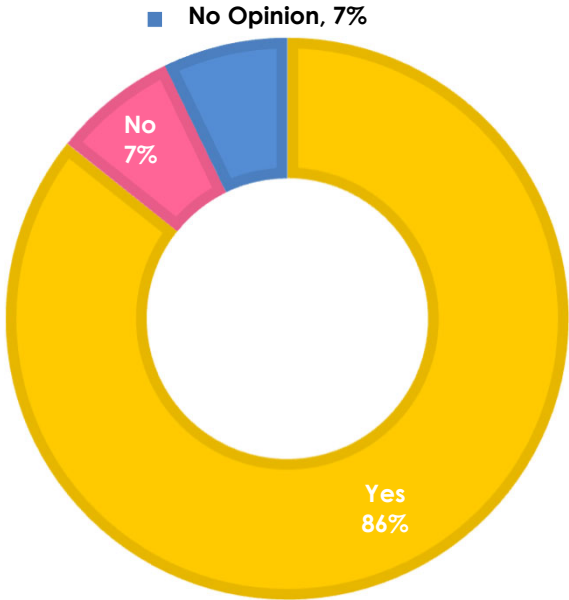

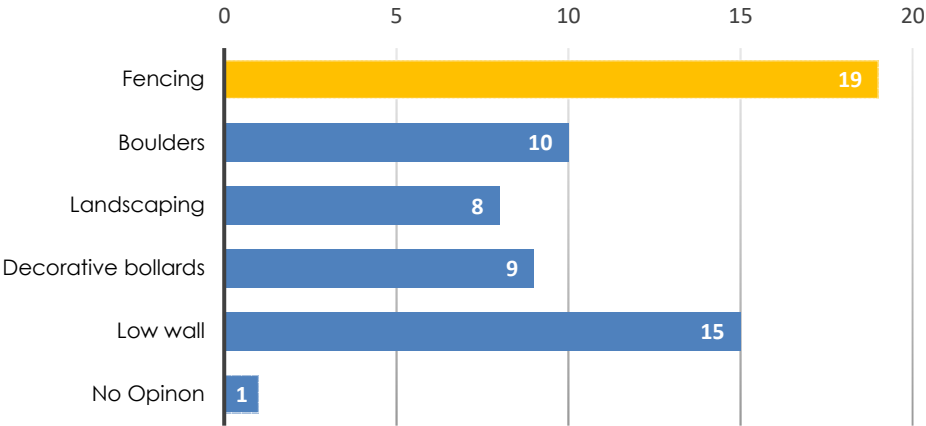

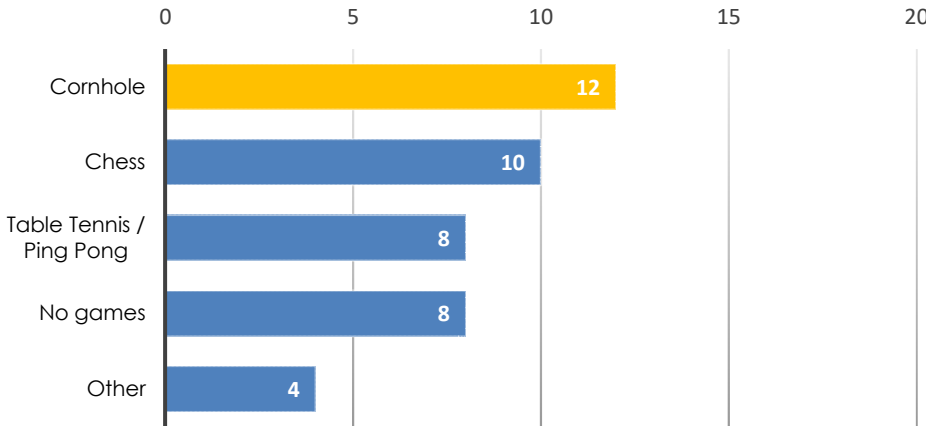
WOULD YOU LIKE A WALKING PATH AROUND THE PLAY AREA?



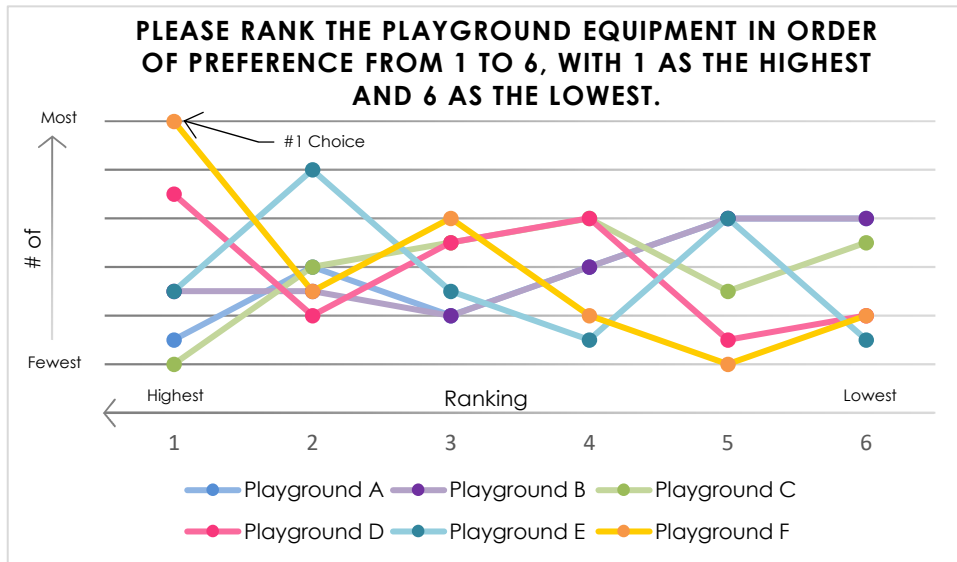
WHAT KIND OF SEPARATION DO YOU PREFER BETWEEN THE ROAD AND THE PLAYGROUND AREA?

Do you have any other comments you'd like to share about the Draft Master Plan?

I like the south end being passive with no playground, games, or community gardens.
Very much like the concept of south end of park being passive, no playground or games, or community gardens. Add plants.
The QR codes on the A-frame dropped at Olive Park directed me to a blank page. Please reach out to organizations who work with disabled communities to ask for how to implement recreational equipment for them as well. Strongly consider having a gazebo with solar installed on the roof where the community can gather, as well as signage in Spanish, Cambodian, Vietnamese, and braille. Please consider reaching out to North Bay Organizing Project if you haven't already done so to discuss how this park could be utilized as a community resilience hub. I did not see bathrooms on the diagrams.
Please provide LOTS of lighting to enhance the landscaping 24 hours a day to prevent drug use, overdoses, homeless move-in, vandalism.
Thanks for bringing this to the community for input!
Looks like a great plan and would benefit the community greatly.
I think planning should take in consideration the tremendous impact homelessness has on our public spaces. If there is less foliage for camping and covered enclosed play structures this beautiful new park may be less attractive for homeless camps.
No plastic fake turf!
Include accessible playground equipment for children who use wheelchairs, walkers, gait trainers, and crutches for their mobility in the playground area.
It's fun to sprinkle little bits of tree stumps or rocks around. Mesquite Park has this great rock cave kids love. Fun stuff like that really brings in a nice presence and a sense of wonder as one explores the surroundings finding those special elements.
The park should have super secure fencing since it's so close in proximity to busy roads and freeways. Lots of large trees should be planted for adequate shaded spaces. Picnic areas. Benches near playgrounds for parents to sit and observe. Bathrooms are a MUST have.

Please just make sure to have good lighting and hold family events and activities constantly so it stays a park and not a homeless camp or drug dealer meet up

Addition of low level lighting on both sides of park and inclusion of some other active area instead of where the community garden is on South A Street. Maybe a half basketball court or exercise stations.
Please make sure that there is a play area specifically for very young children, including a fence with a gate. This is a neighborhood with a lot of foot traffic, and people who sleep in the park (or in their trailer near by). There is often trash (like cigarette butts, household trash, dog poop, etc) in the surrounding areas including the grass lawns, and it would be great to be able to let kids play safely on the play equipment without worrying about them wandering off and picking up dangerous trash/objects (and/or into the street). Not having a fence at the park now is the primary reason I don't bring my son there more often, even though we only live a block away from the park.
Please consider the increasingly hot sun and provide shade fixtures to the playground.
The park is so close to hwy 101 that noise is going to discourage people from using it fully, no matter the amenities. You should scale back the more expensive parts of the plan and save your limited resources to maintain or improve other aspects of underserved neighborhoods. E.g. badly needed separated bike lanes in SW Santa Rosa.
Need a better sound wall to reduce the noise. Make the bridge less prison like. How about a skate park? Have the painted games be pop outs on the walking path. (confusing to have on basketball court). Survey was hard to fill out on a phone. Small images etc. Could only select one in the activities to include section. Would have selected ping pong also. But thanks for doing this.
